#### Lunch at school

From the start of 2021, our school along with many others in Mangere will be in the Lunches in Schools programmes were a lunch will be supplied to every child. We are currently discussing this at our Board of Trustees meeting to decide whether to do every day or have one when children can buy their lunch or bring it from home and what we will do with lunches that are sent to school and a child is away.

Lunches will cater for the diet, health and cultural needs of our students, and we will work with suppliers and the Ministry of Education to make sure they are healthy and nutritious. All suppliers will be required to meet New Zealand food safety standards.

2021 **3<sup>rd</sup> February** Term 1 starts The lunches will be available for all our students. Providing a lunch to every child means we do not need to single-out those who need it more than others. However, lunches are not compulsory, and you can continue to provide your child's own lunch if you wish. As a Mum of 4 children, I found it a lot of work to make 4 school lunches every day and would have loved it, if I didn't have to do it every day.

Right now, we are working with the Ministry of Education on the best way to meet our school's needs. So far, we have opted to join a group of schools and selecting an approved supplier once the Ministry's open tender processes have been completed. The programme will run until the end of 2021 and will be evaluated whilst it is running. This will include feedback from schools, students and suppliers about what the lunches are like, how they are delivered, and if they have an impact on students' learning and achievement.

Holiday Programme from 8 am to 6 pm Monday to Friday. We offer fun and exciting activities daily.


With Covid-19 still hovering around us we are happy to help parents that wish to apply to Work and Income for their After-School care and need help with completing their paperwork.
